CHARITY CD: An unusual new mini-album was released in Cyprus this week, with proceeds going to the Cyprus Research Centre for Muscular Dystrophy. Unusual, because the artist in question, 21 year old, Stelios Pisis, suffers from the debilitating illness and is confined to a wheelchair. This has not prevented him from winning awards over the past three years for his songs and his charity work, however. The six-track album "Psiphides" ("Mosaic Tiles") reveals a musician of considerable talent and a strong, expressive vocal style, and as producer Andreas Georgallis noted at a press launch, Stelios did virtually everything on the disc himself, including the arrangements and playing all the computerised instruments. The album, priced £8, will be available from the Telethon stands around the island this week, from the Cyprus Institute of Neurology and Genetics, branches of the Hellenic Bank, Marks & Spencer and Achelec Electronics.
